Recent Council decisions

MAJOR DECISIONS:

Council has adopted an update of the Civil Security Plan in case of a local disaster. There will be a special meeting of the administrative staff and elected officials for informational and planning purposes, August 9, 2018. Henceforth, practical exercises and simulations will be undertaken periodically. Citizens will be better informed as to what to do in case of a disaster starting this fall.

We have long worked with the projected new treatment plan for organic matters in Cowansville so as to truck our organic matter there, when the new facility opens late in fall, all for an expected cost saving estimated at \$11,000\$. However, the ministry of Environment of Quebec has arbitrarily and unilaterally forbidden the use of starch compostable mini bags at this new facility, such as those we and the rest of the Memphremagog MRC use in our brown bins (even though these bags are accepted where we currently send them at the Coaticook facility). Accordingly, Council has decided to pull out of the informal agreement we had with Cowansville to go there.

Finally, a mandate has been given to a local citizen to act as the operator of an impoundment facility for stray farm animals. Henceforth, the legal mandated municipal inspector will have strayed farm animals sent there and sequestered until the owners pays all upkeep costs and the fines resulting from such straying.

OTHER DECISIONS:

Please consult the provisional minutes of the meeting of Council for August 6, 2018. Decisions were made for:

- routine authorizations:
 - a cycling event through the Township by the organization "Ride to fight ALS"
 - a Beard and Mustache festival in Place Manson in October 2018
 - the renewal of the agreement for subsidized rents at Potton Apartments
 - a municipal grant request under the commercial building renovation program by Euro Delli
 - a grant for half a million dollars under the provincial Local Road Renewal Program (RIRL), for 2019;
- contract management such as:
 - the awarding of the gravel contract for the 2018 RIRL program
 - to accept a subcontractor for the Ecocentre
 - to approve the replacement of a broken water pump at the pumping station in the Owl's Head sector, at a cost of more than \$8,000.
- urbanism cases:
 - One minor exemption and two requests under PIIA for the combined convenience store and SHELL gas station in the Village
 - Another minor exemption on Sugar-Loaf Pound Road and a recurring infraction case for errand farm animals (last 8 years)

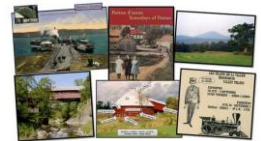


COME JOIN US!

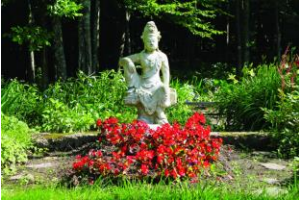

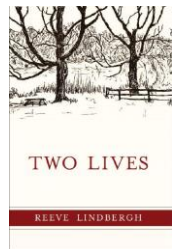


CREATIVE WRITING WORKSHOPS BY ANNE MICHAUD

THE WORD FROM CCDD



Zebra mussels, considered an invasive exotic species, were found in Lake Memphremagog. The zebra mussel quickly colonizes water bodies to the detriment of native molluscs. It does not affect the quality of bathing water, but it clings to hard surfaces and can cause damage to infrastructure, including water



intakes. This news confirms the importance of cleaning boats when changing bodies of water.
