Recent Council decisions

Out of the ordinary decisions

- The municipal council decided to terminate the employment of the Director General, Mr. Thierry Roger. The reasons are confidential and are subject to a transaction without admission of fault and responsibility on both sides. A call for candidacy, to fill the position as quickly as possible, has been posted on several websites and newspapers.
- Refusal of Bell's new attempt to establish a telecommunication tower in the Sugar Loaf sector.

Other decisions

- Mandate to Axion for an internet deployment study in Potton; the study will accompany the potential grant application.
- Hiring of seasonal employees for snow removal on sidewalks, the ecocentre and for the upcoming installation of water meters;
- Awarding of the concrete contract for the renovation of the round barn;
- Mandate to prepare an architectural concept for the construction of the roof over the skating rink, a space soon to become multifunctional;
- Accepting of subcontractors for snow removal and hourly rates for equipment used to remove snow accumulations in the village;
- Proposal to the Ministry of Transport regarding measures to be taken to reduce the speed on Main street;
- Authorization to tender for the connection of the new drinking water supply well;
- Authorization to tender for the rental, transport and disposal of containers for the ecocentre;
- Acceptance of two minor derogations, a request for the transformation of a main building and a modification to the comprehensive development plan for Owl's Head.

Four notice of motions were given regarding Owl's Head, the bylaw on animals, and for a borrowing bylaw for work on the new drinking water well.

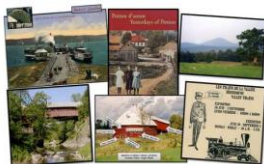
